Grant Aid - Guildford Borough Council has approved grant aid for 50% of the cost of a new slide for younger years, in Shere Recreation Ground play area and a new bench in Gomshall next to the phone box. Prudential RideLondon – Surrey County Council has issued a consultation on the future of the Prudential RideLondon race. Views are now being sought on the event to inform a Surrey County Council Cabinet decision, on whether the event continues in Surrey from 2021 until 2025. Broadband for Surrey Hills (B4SH) — wants to solve rural Surrey Hills' broadband problems. B4SH is installing a hyperfast, brand new, independent, highly reliable, broadband network bringing fibre to the home and business. Speeds will be 1 Gig (1000Mb/sec) download and upload simultaneously — best in class speed, especially in rural areas.

Shere Parish Council has agreed the purchase of £500 of shares (the minimum amount allowed), to indicate support of B4SH objectives and in recognition of the benefit to Peaslake and Holmbury St Mary, if the parish council were able to influence where in future routing should be encouraged.
