## Stay alert, control the virus and save lives

Shere Parish Council contacted Surrey County Council (SCC) for help with managing social distancing in Shere as the lock down eases and the businesses are able to reopen. The overall desire was to create a safe space, large enough for pedestrians to pass one another. To do this, SCC with the parish council's support has installed some temporary barriers in Shere, from the disabled parking space to the bridge and in part of The Square. These will prevent parking along Middle street and create a safer wider pavement for pedestrians. This may not solve the problem of social distancing but together with the recent banners purchased and fixed in all four village centres, it is hoped people will get the message, to give others space. The barriers will be reviewed regularly and adjustments will be made if necessary. Easing of the lockdown has brought increased numbers of visitors and rubbish. Guildford Borough Council has agreed to an additional collection each week.

The council is not re-opening the toilets in Shere at present due to concerns over cleaning and social distancing. We are however, researching self-cleaning cubicles as this may be the right time to consider upgrading the facilities.
