Food parcels will need to be pre-ordered by email. If you have a voucher already, email it to the food bank with your shopping list. Collection or delivery must be pre-arranged.

If you have no voucher but need food, the following organisations can refer you:

Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB), Social Services, Health Visitors, Christians Against Poverty (CAP), Children's centres, Guildford Action for Families, Guildford Borough Council (Family Support Team & Community Wellbeing Team), local schools, many Guildford churches, local community wardens, doctors surgeries, Vaughan House, Home School Link Workers, Probation Service, Youth Support Service, Age UK Surrey or Homestart.

If you are unable to contact these organisations, you can contact the food bank directly but they would prefer a referral.

They have temporarily suspended the requirement to bring a voucher. However, they are asking only those who are in financial crisis come to the foodbank for assistance. Although no voucher is required, clients are being asked to provide their name and the number of adults and children in their household in place of a voucher. They are unable to deliver food parcels and clients must leave after being handed their pre-packed bag.
